In August 2010, construction began in earnest at the site of the Utah County Convention Center, initiating a new era of urbanism and activity in downtown Provo. On the same block in 1911, the completion of the Taylor Brothers Building heralded a new scale and forever altered the fabric of the city. Couched within the framework of this duality, in a space caught between 100 years, a group of graduate students from the College of Architecture + Planning at the University of Utah have envisioned a bold future. It is this zone between the new and the historic where their design proposals attempt to challenge conventional expectations for the city and offer projections on urbanism for a site a century in the making. This small, residual piece of the city offers the perfect canvas on which to explore the boundaries of architecture and confront the constraints and dynamics of an evolving urban context.
