



THE UTAH VALLEY MARATHON IS COMING. BE PREPARED | PLAN YOUR ROUTE 6.9.18

We anticipate that this race will bring over 8,000 runners and visitors to Provo. Participants will be running on roads from the mouth of Provo Canyon on University Avenue to 300 S. We want them to be safe so some driving pattern adjustments will need to be made on that day.

Please take note of the following road closures and recommended routes

University Avenue will be closed during the time of the event from 6AM - 2PM. If you need to cross University Avenue, please do so on 300 S. After 10AM the only other crossing opportunities will be at:

- » 4800 North
- » 3700 North
- » University Parkway
- » Bulldog Boulevard

Expect significant delays if crossing at these areas during this time

Provo Canyon will be down to one lane as the second lane will be designated to runners. Expect major delays as the right-of-way will go to the nearly 8,000 runners.

VOTE BY MAIL

The June 26 Primary Election will be conducted by mail. If you have changes to your voter registration or address, update it at vote.utah.gov or visit the Utah County Election office located at *100 E Center St. Suite 3100 Provo, UT 84606.*

You may return your ballot in the following ways -

BY MAIL - mail your ballot postmarked no later than the day before the election. **DROP OFF** - drop off your ballot at any Utah County voter service center.

A voter service center will be available on Primary Election day at the Provo Recreation Center from 7 AM - 8 PM. If you do not receive a ballot in the mail or you loose/misplace your ballot you can stop by the service center and vote provisionally. Registered voters must bring a current ID (driver license with their current address or two items that have their current address).
