Dumpsters

Dispose of trash, yard waste, and metals free of charge using dumpsters located throughout the city March 23 to May 2 Mon.— Fri. 8 AM—6 PM and Sat. 8 AM—3 PM (Dumpsters at Compost Yard are open Mon.—Thu. 8 AM—5 PM and Fri.— Sat. from 7 AM—5 PM). Please separate the yard waste and metals from the trash and put them in the appropriate dumpsters. Dumpsters will be closed nightly, and it is unlawful to leave items on the ground.

Unacceptable Items

Please do not dispose of rocks, tires, concrete, tree stumps, refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, or household hazardous waste such as pesticides in the dumpsters or at the transfer station. No lumber, building material, treated wood, logs over 10" in diameter or trash at the Compost Yard. If you have questions about what is acceptable, call Provo City Customer Service at 3-1-1 or (801) 852-6000, or the transfer station at (801) 489-3027.

Yard Waste Collection

Turn your organic yard waste into plant nourishing compost. Sign up for green can yard waste collection by calling (801) 852-6000. Green cans are picked up once a week from March 2—November 27. No trash is allowed in the green can.

Provo Compost Yard

During Spring Cleanup drop off at the Compost Yard will be FREE during those weeks. Organic compost will be available to purchase for residents at \$3 per yard, and for nonresidents at \$6 per yard, depending on availability.

Transfer Station

Provo City residents may take trash directly to the South Utah Valley Solid Waste District transfer station located at 2450 W. 400 S. Springville, free of charge using the coupon from March 23 to May 2, during normal business hours, Mon.—Sat. from 7 AM—6 PM. All loads must be covered to avoid a \$4 tarp fee.

Voters approved the Police, Fire & City Facilities Bond in November 2018, authorizing the City to issue up to \$69 million in general obligation bonds for the new Provo City Center.

The existing city center, built in 1972, is not seismically sound and is inadequate in meeting the needs of Provo citizens. Ultimately, it was far more cost-effective to replace than rebuild.

The new 164,000 square foot building, located at the corner of Center Street and 500 West, will anchor our downtown, improve operational efficiencies and streamline the citizen's experience.

More than half of the Provo City Center will be devoted to public safety, housing our new police and fire headquarters.

The Provo City Center will be the 'Citizen's City Center,' so it's important you be able to track the construction progress, know your money is being wisely spent and feel confident we are keeping the promises we made to you.

2020 TREE LINE AND TREE CITY USA AWARDS

Provo City Power's Forestry Division has received two awards this year for practices that protect and enhance America's urban forests.


Our Forestry Division earned two recognitions for meeting and exceeding their goals established by the Arbor Day Foundation.

- Providing quality tree-care practices;
- Educating the public about planting trees for energy conservation to reduce peak power demand;
- Helping homeowners plant appropriate trees near utility lines;
- Planting and maintaining a robust urban forest to line the streets of Provo.

TREE LINE USA

For 23 consecutive years, Provo City Power has received this recognition, and holds the longest standing record in the State of Utah for this. In Provo, there are over 30,000 utility trees. On average, our crews either prune, remove and replace over 8,000 trees a year that are in or near electrical utility lines. By doing this, not only are we maintaining and protecting the urban forest in Provo, we are maintaining our power infrastructure and reducing tree related power outages. We can't eliminate tree caused outages entirely, but as the chart shows our progress and a steady decline for many years.

TREE CITY USA

For 35 consecutive years, Provo City Power has received this recognition by maintaining the urban forest in Provo which includes all of the city street trees. Currently, Provo City has 13,177 street trees (20 different tree species). Of the 13,000 street trees, 1,164 street trees were pruned, 372 dead and/or hazardous trees were removed, and 453 new trees were planted in park strips throughout the city last year. These numbers are pretty typical and show our dedication to not only maintain the current greenspace in Provo, but to also plant more trees than are removed to add to our already beautiful city for the future.

Our robust forestry programs offer many benefits to our customers in numerous ways including providing cleaner air and water, conserving energy by reducing peak power demand, increasing property values and improving quality-of-life. We are proud to be a major contributor in maintaining the beautiful landscape and greenspace that we've all come to love about Provo.
