Conditions of approval:

- 1. Wood clad windows will need to fit the existing openings.
- 2. Any changes to the plans would need to come back to the Landmarks Commission for approval.

STAFF PRESENTATION

The Staff Report to the Landmarks Commission provides details of the facts of the case and the Staff's analysis, conclusions, and recommendations.

NEIGHBORHOOD AND PUBLIC COMMENT

The Neighborhood Chair was not present or did not address the Landmarks Commission during the hearing. Neighbors or other interested parties did not address the Landmarks Commission.

CONCERNS RAISED BY PUBLIC

APPLICANT RESPONSE

Key points addressed in the applicant's presentation to the Landmarks Commission included the following:

• The applicant stated that they have not identified any original windows and that after going through plans from 1979 and 1992 determined that much of the courtyard facing structures are additions.

- They have found many of the windows to be rotted and beyond repair.
- They have looked at the cost to repair compared to replace the windows and found it to be cheaper to replace the windows.
- The applicant stated that there are no plans to demolish any of the existing structures or do any additions.

LANDMARKS COMMISSION DISCUSSION

Key points discussed by the Landmarks Commission included the following:

- Typically, in favor of retaining and repairing the original, but felt for this project that replacement would be preferred.
- There was a desire to see the proposed windows as part of a rendering so they could see how they would work in this space.

FINDINGS / BASIS OF LANDMARKS COMMISSION DETERMINATION

The Landmarks Commission identified the following findings as the basis of this decision or recommendation:

- With the location in the courtyard and the varied condition of the windows there would be a benefit to having the windows replaced for this project rather than repaired like would typically be the desire for historic structures.
- Seeing the proposed windows rendered and reviewed would be helpful.
