 - a. Angie Carter, Provost: She is interested in getting a park closer to their neighborhood with restroom facilities.
 - b. Rick West, Provost: 1. Improvements to Slate Canyon area—water tank area-- (park, pickle ball courts). 2. 900 E UTA Stop (closer to BYU). 3. Bike/Walk Provo— off street bike path has been charted from Bicentennial to Provost, need signage.
 - c. Ken Millar, Spring Creek: Comments meetings should equal the board doing something and following through. A concern is Ironton Industrial Park—tow off right against residential area, plus eight zoning violations.
 - d. Mary Millar, Spring Creek: There are two tow yards in the neighborhood, we need to address it. There are four storage units down the way. We need to make SE Provo, the gateway to the city, beautiful.

 - a. People dumping pallets were caught and issued a citation.

- b. No update on the individual threatening people.
 - c. Slate Canyon needs help with speeding cars (last week a car turned and totaled three parked cars).
 - i. There are only two radars in the city to share.
 - ii. Roundabouts were suggested and worked on but when those employees left there was no record of what was discussed.
 - d. Enforcing running red lights with cameras on the traffic light poles—they are not enforcement cameras, they are sensed cameras.
 - e. Bill to bring back traffic cameras to be discussed in legislature.
 - f. Downtown District and Provo South—If you see graffiti or see someone doing it, please share the pic or video. Share it even if you think you don't have anything (they are good at using the evidence they have).
 - g. Use "Hide, Lock, Keep" to keep your stuff safe. Bike thefts are big in the city. Over half the bikes aren't even locked up. Porch lights deter crime.
5. Provo School District Update (Meg Van Wagenen 7:20-7:35 PM)
- a. Wasatch Elementary rebuild: This is the last school to be rebuilt. The site it will be on has been under site work for months. The new Wasatch site is on Locust Lane. It was a land swap with BYU. It will be a three-story building built into the mountain. Four classrooms per grade.
