I recently asked Provo's Economic Director, Keith Morey, to share what exciting things are happening on our city's economic and commercial front. He quickly responded, "What direction would you like me to discuss? North, south, east, or westeverywhere you turn, something remarkable is happening in Provo!" One of Provo's Four Pillars, Economically Vibrant, is a vision that impacts every Provo resident. We are investing in business retention, attraction, location, and development here in our community.

Provo has grown and changed much over the last few decades. While it's sometimes hard to see the city that we love advance and develop, Provo's economic growth has a significant effect on the quality of life for our residents: less travel for work, employment opportunities that appeal to rising generations, and increased earning potential. These measures are also hallmarks of a healthy economy. In fact, when Provo was chosen by the Milken Institute as the top-performing city in the nation (three years in a row!), these and other economic measures played a significant role in securing that award.

and FIRST for five-year growth for wages. While those markers contributed to a #1 spot for Best Performing City, there are other top spots where Provo is continuing to show up. We recently ranked as the top city for most satisfied workers, the top city for the job market, and as something that speaks so much to who we are. Provo just ranked as the #1 most charitable city.

I have the regular opportunity to meet with leaders and executives at Provo's beautiful City Hall. The view from our offices allows me to guide their sights across the city as we take in Provo's tapestry. What makes Provo appealing to businesses is the same thing that makes it appealing to residents: thriving businesses, world-class educational opportunities, an incredible hospital that offers high-quality care, leisure and recreational opportunities in abundance, and those beloved neighborhoods that still maintain that raise-yourfamily-here essence.







WINTER FIRE SAFETY TIPS

During wintertime and the holiday seasons, there is a greater risk of home fires. However, these fires can be prevented by following a few simple safety tips:

- 1. Make sure you have working smoke and carbon monoxide detectors in your home.
- 2. Keep anything flammable at least 3 feet away from any portable heating unit. Plug only one heating unit into an electrical outlet at a time.
- 3. Have a professional inspect your chimney and vents each year.
- 4. Store cooled ashes outside in an airtight metal container at least 10 feet from your home or any building.
- 5. Keep candles 12 inches away from anything that can burn. Consider using battery-powered candles.
- 6.Do not plug multiple extension cords together and never run an extension cord under rugs or furniture.



STATE HOMELESS LAW UPDATE



Last session, the state legislature enacted a new homelessness law requiring larger counties to establish a plan to shelter those in need throughout the winter (October 15 to April 30). The law was passed as House Bill 499 and is found at Utah Code Section 35A-16.

Utah County's first plan needs to be submitted by August 1, 2024, to cover that following winter. Under the law, a task force has been set up to create the plan. The voting members include a county commissioner and several mayors from within Utah County. Non-voting members include representatives from local non-profits and even a number of persons who have experienced homelessness.

RAISING THE BARK: A PAW-SITIVE CHANGE FOR OUR OPEN SPACES



Ever felt like your morning jog was more of a game of dodge-the-dog than actual exercise? We frequently hear complaints of unleashed canines, rogue poop, and sidewalk slip 'n' slides—it's become a bit of a "ruff" situation.

We want to make sure everyone is aware, it is the law in Provo City that:

- -animals must be on-leash when not confined on the owner's property;
- -animal waste must be promptly cleaned up and removed from both public and private property (unless you have the owner's permission).

Violation of these laws is a criminal offense and typically results in a fine of at least \$150 (the judge could order up to \$1,000). Our animal control and police officers will issue citations for these violations.

We understand that the majority of pet owners in our community are responsible and caring individuals who prioritize the well-being of their furry companions and fellow residents. However, the actions of a few can have a significant impact on the overall quality of life for everyone. Our enforcement efforts are not meant to punish responsible pet owners, but rather to deter those who disregard city ordinances and common decency.


